John Pang Joins the Tahoe City Public Utility District Board of Directors

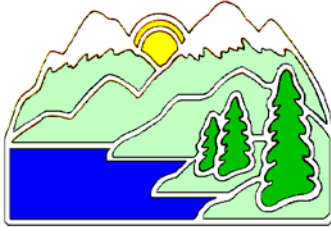
Tahoe City, CA – January 5, 2015

After receiving the most votes in the Tahoe City Public Utility District's first ever open election, John Pang will join the TCPUD Board of Directors this month. Mr. Pang begins his 4 year term on the TCPUD Board with a wealth of experience, including 15 years as a Director with two local water Districts. Mr. Pang is the recently retired Fire Chief of Meeks Bay Fire Department after 19 years of service, a graduate of UC Davis, holds several certificates and course work in Special District Management and has logged countless hours of volunteer time with numerous organizations in the Truckee/North Tahoe region. Mr. Pang is a staunch supporter of improved water systems for the public's health and safety and understands the overall value of water to our community. "I look forward to carrying on the good work that my predecessor accomplished over his long tenure and to work with the excellent PUD team in meeting our mission and serving our community", said John Pang.

"When we moved to an open election system it was our hope that it would entice qualified prospective directors to run and not have to challenge a specific person for a specific seat," said Ron Treabess", Director for the District. "We feel this year's election was a success as there were 5 candidates running for 2 open seats." I look forward with much enthusiasm to working alongside John Pang, a long-time community activist and supporter." said Treabess.

Mr. Pang's first term begins with his swearing in at the December 19th monthly TCPUD board meeting. "We welcome John and look forward to working with he and the rest of our board to continue providing the best possible service to our tax payers, rate payers and visitors", said Gustafson.
