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***Please help us find a place to teach our children to swim!***


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Teaching children how to swim is critical for their safety, especially when living next to Lake Tahoe. For over 20 years, TCPUD has contracted with local Homeowner Associations with pools, to offer families in our community the opportunity to take swim lessons. Thanks to the homeowners and staff at Granlibakken, we have a hugely successful program that is run at the Granlibakken pool; however we are at capacity at this site and are currently turning away families due to a lack of space.

Each year, TCPUD has a waiting list for swim lessons because we do not have enough access to local swimming pools to accommodate our children. If you know of a swimming pool that could provide this valuable service, please let us know. TCPUD needs use of a pool for three (non-peak) hours per day, four days per week, for a six week period. TCPUD takes pride in providing outstanding recreational opportunities to the entire community and we do not want to have to turn people away.

#### About the TCPUD

The Tahoe City Public Utility District provides water, sewer and recreation services throughout the district boundaries. The boundaries of the District lie within both Placer and El Dorado Counties, extending from Emerald Bay to Dollar Hill, and along the Truckee River to the Nevada County line. Sewer collection, parks facilities, and recreation services are provided for the entire area of the District. Water service is provided in five separate systems and serves approximately half of the homes and businesses in the District.
